

THE BEER LIST HALLOWEEN 2024

CASK BAR

Battersea Brewery, The Arches, Circus West, Battersea Power Station SW11

1. Admiral's Best 4.2% Malty amber bitter. Roast nuttiness on nose and taste remain with Seville orange, cocoa and dates. Dry, bitter sweet aftertaste.
2. Amber Nectar 4.5% A fabulous easy drinking proper bitter. Has a certain fruitiness turning into a malty, caramel finish. Perfect.

Bass, Burton (under licence by Marston's)

3. Bass Premium 4.4% The Bass red triangle is the worlds first and therefore oldest registered trade mark and can even be seen in "A Bar at the Folies Bergère" by Édouard Manet painted in 1882.

The beer is richly fragrant with a hoppy bouquet. It has a complex nutty, malty taste and a bright chestnut hue. For those my age this beer was omnipresent in each of the 6,000 Bass Charrington pubs of our adolescence.

Cloudwater, Manchester

4. Epostrophe 4.0% A triple hopped Pale Ale combo of Citra, Centennial and Columbus in this modern brew. Offering a bright citrus note with a herbaceous finish.

Dark Star, was West Sussex, now brewed by Asahi/Fullers in Chiswick.

Dark Star Brewery was established in 1994, brewing in the cellar of the Evening Star public house in Brighton. In 2001 the company moved production to Ansty, West Sussex, before moving again to Partridge Green in 2010. In February 2018, Dark Star was acquired by Fuller's with James Cuthbertson staying on as its managing director. It was a condition of the sale that the beers would NEVER be brewed in Chiswick. But in August 2018 the brewery confirmed that some of its flagship "Hophead" pale ale was being produced by Fuller's in London. In January 2019, Fuller's sold its entire drinks business, including The Dark Star Brewing Company, to Japan's Asahi Breweries. In November 2022, Asahi Breweries announced that it would close the Dark Star Brewery in Partridge Green, with the entire Dark Star portfolio moving to its Meantime Brewery in Greenwich, London. In March 2024 Asahi announced the closure of Meantime Brewery. Asahi now brew Dark Star beers at the Fuller's Brewery in Chiswick. All of which just goes to show that whenever you get into bed with the big boys you get fucked over.

5. Hophead 3.4% Hoppy and golden with a distinct floral aroma and mighty elderflower hit from the cascade hops. A great session beer. Try now before it inevitably disappears from the Asahi portfolio.

Deya Brewing, Lansdown Industrial Estate, Gloucester Rd, Cheltenham, Gloucester

6. Gardeners Ale 5% A crisp English bitter. Light bready malt upfront with a peachy, plummy sweetness with notes of tea, and a firm bitter finish. Deya have finally brewed a traditional cask bitter. Using plumage archer malt from Oxfordshire. This beer was

hopped with East Kent Goldings and Bramling Cross to give classic noble UK hop character with a touch of dark fruit aroma and flavour.

Downton Salisbury, Wiltshire

Long time supplier to the Wandsworth Common Festival Martin Strawbridge is at the forefront of modern cask brewing and has stayed loyal to cask preferring not to go down the route of keg like so many other brewers. Instead, his ever changing seasonal range, plus core favourites, remain faithful to traditional beer production methods and techniques.

7. Honey Blonde 4.3% Straw coloured golden ale. Fresh and fruity infused with real honey

8. Chocolate Orange 5.8% The ONLY beer that has been at all 30 Wandsworth Common beer festivals. A long time festival favourite and previous winner of “Best in Wandsworth” Enriched with a bottle of Cointreau in every brew. With it being Halloween and Lord Battersea being very superstitious we just cannot contemplate not having a couple of Martins Strawbridge’s excellent beers.

9. Roman Imperial Stout 10% Dark and intense. Only brewed occasionally. An abundance of chocolate and roasted coffee flavours and aromas

Drop Project, Mitcham, Surrey

10. Toasty 4.3% Red Ale

11. Choppy 4.8% Irish Stout

Harveys, Lewes, Sussex

The oldest independent brewery in Sussex. A family business, the brewery has been in the guardianship of seven generations of John Harvey's descendants since 1790, with five family members from the seventh and eighth generations currently working here. Still a privately-owned limited company, Harvey's remarkably has no shares marketed for external investment.

12. Dark Mild 3.0% Malty and Mellow. Soft and slightly sweet with a dry, nutty aftertaste akin to an infusion of ground nuts. Dark Mild accounted for 75% of beer produced during the decade following the Second World War and was the mainstay of a generation in the public bar. But today few breweries produce a top flight dark mild. Thankfully, Harveys brew this all year round making it one of the very few regularly produced Milds in the South of England

13. Pelles Pale Ale 3.7% Draws its name from the Sussex word 'Pell,' meaning a large body of water. Sussex Spring Water from Lewes is the defining element of all Harveys beers. An exceptionally pale ale combining Motueka with UK hops to deliver a citrus aroma, and bitter finish. Hop-forward, flavourful, and light,

14. Old 4.3% Soft and full-bodied, with hints of dried fruits and dates. Rich, dark and warming. Available only in the autumn and winter months.

15. Armada 4.5% Dry-hopped. A golden ale with a vibrant hop tone and a dry finish. Robust & refreshing

16. Southdown Harvest 5.0% Produced each year with hops fresh “green” from the Harvey’s farm. Blending three unique hop varieties with a trio of different malts uniting soft sweet biscuit tones, and tangy ‘green hop’ bitterness.

17. Star of Eastbourne 5.5% This golden IPA exudes a full hop aroma, with subtle hints of marmalade. First brewed to mark the Eastbourne Beer Festival in October 2004. A strong, old style India Pale Ale reminiscent of the beers exported across the globe by British breweries during the early nineteenth century. The crisp bitterness lingers on the palate giving a dry finish. Highly recommended

18. Prince of Denmark 7.5% One of the great beers of the World and rarely available on draught even in Harveys tied houses. A strong, dark beer of great complexity and depth. Brown, amber and black malts are mixed with pale ale malts to give this beer its strong aroma and colouring. MUST TRY

Hook Norton, Brewery Lane, Hook Norton, Oxford

Brewery visits can be rather disappointing if you find that your favourite beer is brewed in shed on a modern industrial estate. No such problems with a visit to Hook Norton which is everyone's picture postcard of what a tower brewery should look like. The entire operation runs off a steam engine with leather bands running off various wheels to send power to all parts of the brewery.

19. Off the Hook 4.3% A strong combination of citrus and orange notes delivering a full on refreshing beer.

20. Old Hooky 4.6% A classic reddish ruby coloured bitter. First brewed to celebrate the Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977 but became so popular has been kept brewing ever since. The cornerstone of the brewery range. Beautifully balanced, fruity by nature, with a well-rounded body. MUST TRY

Kent Brewery, Kent

21. Halloween Scream 4.7% A seasonally black IPA brewed for Halloween period only

Kissingate Brewery, Horsham, Surrey

Started life at a private address in Crawley, West Sussex. In April 2010 registered as a commercial brewery and with planning consent and other permissions granted began the Kissingate journey. After just a few months brewing from home they ran out of capacity. In September 2010 they found a suitable unit on Church Lane Farm Estate in Lower Beeding near Horsham brewing predominantly dark milds porters & stouts. So, in other words, the perfect brewing operation in the view of Lord Battersea.

22. Black Cherry Mild 4.2% A full fruit and flavoursome dark mild. Subtle additions of real black cherries and gentle hopping provide a truly wonderful taste experience. MUST TRY

23. Kissingate Moon 4.5% A refreshing pale beer with a hoppy character, subtle mango and citrus fruit undertones.

24. Chennai IPA 5.0% Notes of sweet oranges, grapefruit, lemons, resin, pine with a floor roasted malty backbone to carry a lasting bitter sweet finish.

25. Extreme Jamaica Stout 6.0% A rich bitter-sweet stout. Subtle liquorice, coffee and molasses flavours with a hint of rum on the nose.

26. Undertakers Varnish 7.0% A full bodied stout. Notes of caramel and custard cream biscuit. Slightly smoky with a creamy chocolate finish.

27. Raisin the Bar 14% Flagship double mashed imperial stout. A beautifully complex fusion of dark chocolate confection and bourbon biscuit.

MUST TRY BEFORE YOU DIE

Oakham, Maxwell Road, Peterborough

28. Reapers Wish 4.5% Smooth, dark brown in colour and complex with a spiky hop character. Robust spicy berry and woody hop flavours scythe through a cloak of dark malt.

29. OPA 4.0% A golden pale ale. Oakham Original Pale Ale has been specially brewed for the distributor Dayla and this Festival.

Rudgate, Marston Business Park, Tockwith, York

30. Ruby Mild 4.4% Multi award winning beer. Ruby red colour with complex velvet finish

31. York Chocolate Stout 5.0% A rich, deeply complex stout with roasted, coffee flavours.

St. Austell, Cornwall

32. Thunderstruck 4.5% Mahogany in colour. Dark fruit aroma, fruity & malty palate.

Sambrook's, Wandsworth London SW18

What can you say about this wonderful brewer who started as Young's left us. Then lost their Yelverton Road brewery to developers only to be offered the Heritage Brewery site on the old Young's site. Truly a Phoenix from the ashes story. Once again John Hatch has produced a memorable one off for this festival only. Plus 3 different Imperial Stouts

33. Junction 4.5% Named with a nod to our local train station Clapham Junction. This is a rich, premium ale. Sweeter than Wandle it is brewed with Maris otter Pale and a dose of crystal and roasted barley with Challenger, Goldings and Bramling X hops.

34. Pumphouse Pale Ale 4.2% Named after the local landmark in Battersea Park. An English style Pale Ale with a balanced sweetness and hop character, late hopped with Ernest to give a pleasant floral, and light spice aroma. A classic English Pale Ale.

35. Evergreen Greenhop 4.3% This straw-coloured beer is a celebration of Yakima Valley hops, so delivers plenty of punchy citrus, pine resin and tropical fruit notes.

36. Powerhouse Porter 4.9% Powerhouse Porter is a classic example of London-style porter. Rich with dark chocolate, aromas of coffee and smoke and a smooth toasted finish. A style of beer synonymous with London. Inspired by Battersea's most famous landmark the Power Station.

37. Valhalla 5.0% Healthy dose of American hops, this beer is more of an American-style Red Ale but brewed with Norwegian Kveik (meaning 'yeast') which loves to ferment at extremely warm

temperatures to provide fruity flavours. A complex combination of fruit, blackcurrant, toasted malt and zesty hops make this a must drink beer. **MUST TRY**

38. Block Party 5.5% A cross-over IPA, this beer has the intense, juicy tropical aromas from a modern New England style IPA, coupled with the drinkability and balanced bitterness of the old-school West Coast IPAs that changed the craft beer world. It uses all US hops and has a bright golden colour.

39. Nine Elms Barley Wine 6.0% Another in a series of Wandsworth Council inspired beers to celebrate Lord Battersea's election to Wandsworth Council.

Theakston's

40. Best 3.8% Golden amber beer. Bittersweet balance, subtle hop character described as sweet and fruity.

41. Old Peculier 5.6% Deep, dark, ruby coloured ale with a rich, fruity flavour with hints of black cherry and banana. Possibly one of the country's most well-known and loved ales. This unique, brew is a personal; favourite of Lord Battersea and is sold literally all over the world. The name pays tribute to the unique ecclesiastical status of Masham as a 'Court of the Peculier' and is also a reference to the strong characteristic of the beer. An awesome full-bodied flavour with subtle cherry and rich fruit overtones.

MUST TRY

Thornbridge, Bakewell, Derbyshire

42. Brother Rabbit 4.0% One of Thornbridge's earliest recipes, Brother Rabbit is their Golden Ale offering in cask. Norfolk malt which gives a great base to the beer and a lightly resinous character, the hops present lemon flavour with grassy hints.

Brother Rabbit pours lemon zest in colour with a clean, hoppy aroma. A dry palate, resinous finish and some bitterness.

43. Lord Marbles 4.0% This was the first ever Thornbridge beer. Brewed in 2005 at the Hall Brewery. Mahogany in colour with flavours of honey and caramel with a light bitterness in the finish.

It's named after Mr Marples, a former owner of Thornbridge Hall, who enjoyed using the title of Lord while never quite achieving it officially, NB just like our own Lord Battersea

44. Jaipur 5.9% Thornbridge's flagship beer, and the one that really put them on the map back in 2005 A modern classic. It's usually recognised as the first UK craft IPA, and was brewed with a huge amount of US hops at a time where this was very unusual, these provide a fantastic grapefruit, lemon and tropical fruit with an enticing bitterness.

Timothy Taylor

45. Dark Ruby Mild 3.4% A dark ruby beer with roasted notes and a smooth, creamy taste. A favourite of lovers of a good mild. And if all Mild was this good we would all be drinking it. Especially popular in East Lancashire and one of the finest dark Yorkshire milds still in independent production.

The ABV has recently changed from 3.5% to 3.4% in order to benefit from the new lower duty rates. Given the change is only 0.1% of alcohol adjustments to fermentation, it is hoped that this will be imperceptible to the drinker

46. Landlord Dark 4.3% Not the usual, but the unusual and rarely seen Landlord Dark which originates from the multi award-winning Landlord Pale Ale but brewed with caramelised sugars to give a rich yet light and drinkable dark ale. This balanced mellow dark beer has body and depth. It has a fruity, toasted aroma with hints of chocolate, citrus and roasted malts on the tongue. A darker shade of pale! MUST TRY

Titanic, Burselem

47. Iceberg 4.0% Pale ale with strong, lingering citrus aromas. Expect hints of grapefruit and a powerful hoppy finish. First brewed in 1993, this Extra Pale Ale was one of the first British beers to use US hop varieties.

48. White Star 4.5% Named after the shipping line that operated the Titanic, this golden ale is dry-hopped to give it a powerful fruity aroma. Distinctive, hoppy golden ale with a rich, fruity aroma and a full-bodied taste.

49. Raspberry Pale Ale 4.7% A strong, fruity pale ale with bags of flavour, As with their famous plum porter Titanic have worked hard to ensure the raspberry flavours bounce off the hops perfectly to result in a unique, refreshing pale beer. MUST TRY

50. Plum Porter 4.9% First brewed in 2011 as a one-off seasonal, this multi-award winning Plum Porter has gone on to become a genre-defining speciality beer often imitated but NEVER equalled. Well-rounded speciality porter with a sweet, fruity nose. Notes of plum and other stone fruits are present throughout, balanced against a delicate blend of classic hops. a totally brilliant beer MUST TRY

Tring Brewery, Dunsley Farm, London Road, Tring, Hertfordshire

51. Piggeries 3.8% A classic English Amber ale with fruit aromas layered over flavours of biscuit, caramel and toffee. Balanced with a gentle bitterness from spicy First Gold hops.

52. Ridgeway 4.0% Defined by the UK malts balanced with the fruity characteristics of Styrian Goldings hops. This is a classic English ale

Vale Brewery, Tramway Business Park, Ludgershall Road, Brill, Aylesbury

53. Gravitass 4.8% Zesty flavours giving othis pale ale a punchy hop hit, complimented by a smooth malt backbone.

54. Black Beauty 4.4% Rich roasted malts followed by a sweet, chocolaty finish. Tracing its heritage back to the smokestacks of London, This black porter combines natural Buckinghamshire water with a five-malt blend to create a deep flavour.

Verdant, Falmouth, Cornwall

Started in 2014 Verdant make beers that are rightly highly regarded. Began life back in 2014 by home brewers Adam and James who teamed to create craft US-inspired beers that weren't then available. Over the years they have become synonymous with hop-forward beer styles which are hoppy, juicy, hazy, unfiltered and vegan-friendly beers.

55. Light Bulb 4.5% Juicy and vibrant Extra Pale Ale. It pours a hazy golden colour with a fluffy white head. The finish is refreshing and dry with a subtle bitterness and biscuity flavour.

Wadsworth, Folly Road Brewhouse Folly Road, Devizes

56. Horizon 4.0% Pale golden ale with zesty citrus aromas and a crisp taste.

57. 6X 4.1% This ale is amber-hued and distinctively full bodied. The nose is malty and fruity with a balancing hoppy note. The delicious malt and fruit character emerge on the palate with a long, lingering malty finish. An English classic. Coopers used to mark casks with a whitewashed cross (or 'X') to denote the beer's strength. As this beer's ABV was originally 6%, Coopers would mark XXXXXX. One day a 'lazy' Cooper simply wrote '6' followed by a single 'X' on the cask and that's how 6X got its name! First brewed 5th December 1923.

Wimbledon Brewery, London SW19

Two beers from master brewer Derek Prentice who has blended his XXXD Barley Wine with Copper Leaf to produce Fallen Leaf and the Quartermaine to produce a Quartermaine Special.

58. Fallen Leaf 4.3% Only brewed once specially for this festival

59. Quartermaine Special 6.7% Superb brew. The ultimate English IPA, personally brewed by Master Brewer, Derek Prentice. Derek called on all his 50 years' brewing experience to create this stunning beer. Probably his masterpiece in brewing terms. Named after William Quartermaine, who was one of the owners of the original Wimbledon Brewery, this English style IPA is brewed with only the finest possible ingredients. The fruity, spicy, floral hop aromas lead to a full, rich, almost light fruit cake middle palate, ending with a clean dry bitter finish. MUST TRY if only to remind you what true IPA should taste like before it got hi-jacked by US craft scene.

60. XXXD 12.5% The barley wine base for the 2 beers above. But can you handle it?

Wychwood

The home of Hobgoblin closed its doors November 2023 after Carlsberg Marston's Brewing Company (CMBC) swung the axe on yet another once independent brewery. Production of Hobgoblin will now be concentrated at the group's huge brewery in Burton-on-Trent, and the future of the Witney site is unclear.

61. Hobgoblin Dark Ruby 4.5% The definitive Halloween beer. Distinct ruby beer with sweet caramel and fruity aromas. Brewed with Chocolate and Crystal malts & a blend of Fuggles and Styrian Golding hops. Full-bodied toffee flavour and a fruity finish of figs, raisins and dates.

Wylam, Palace of Arts, Exhibition Park, Newcastle upon Tyne, Tyne & Wear

62. Fleek 4.2% Pale ale utilising cold side hopping. Fresh crop CITRA and AMARILLO pirouette, gambol and frisk, resonating together in a fresh citrus zest followed by a soft peach fruit conclusion.

K63. Clem Fanmango 7.5% Double dry hopped IPA with added mango and passionfruit

Azvex Brewing Co, Gibraltar Row, Liverpool

K64 Development Hell 5 6.8% Citra, Nelson Sauvin, Motueka & Riwaka collab With Time & Tide. Double IPA Hazy

K65 Wereshark 6.8% Big fruity Hazy IPA with massive hop boost from dry hopped Nelson Sauvin, Idaho-7, & Cascade

Battersea Brewery, The Arches, Power Station SW11

K66. BlackberryFields Forever 3.5% SOUR Brewed in collaboration with Kidd Squid brewery from NY. A table sour with US simcoe and blackberries. With red berry and pine notes. Low gravity but big flavour

K67. Banana's in Pyjamas 5.9% Bananas in pyjamas, Are coming down the stairs, Bananas in pyjamas, Are coming down in pairs, Bananas in pyjamas, Are chasing teddy bears. Andrew Justin's favourite children's programme now a best selling Wheat beer.

K68. Black Abyss 5.0% Makes all the Dublin based stout look piss poor by comparison. An excellent stout making good use of London's hard water. It is no wonder Guinness ice cold 0.0% is such a big seller the standard 4.1% version doesn't really taste of anything either.

Columbia Craft Brewing, South Carolina USA

K69. Carolinian 4.7% VEGAN Crisp ale is the backbone of the entire Columbia Craft brewing program. Developed with a clean malt backbone, low bitterness, and just a touch of honey malt sweetness.

K70 Citrus All Pro 5.8% This Citra, Mosaic and Simcoe dry-hopped pale ale bursts with strong flavours of pineapple, grapefruit, and papaya onto your palate. With a healthy dose of oats.

Deya Brewing, Lansdown Industrial Estate, Gloucester Rd, Cheltenham, Gloucester

K71. Thinking Juice 3.4% VEGAN (will be Hazy) Pale light haze with a tropical, floral aroma followed by layers of tropical fruit and orange with a light bitterness to finish.

K72. Hokum Stomp 5.6% VEGAN (will be Hazy) This is an English porter brewed with many different chocolate and biscuit malts over a base of Maris Otter. Chocolate biscuit and deep caramel flavour lead to a sweet body with red berry aroma from Bramling Cross hops.

Drop Project, Mitcham, Surrey

An Eco conscious brewery, who attempt to create as little a negative impact on the world as possible when brewing. Spent grain is recycled into local agricultural as animal feed and they have reduced CO2 usage in the brewery by 90%. They have a one tree one brew policy, where Drop Project commit to planting a tree for every batch brewed. At their Mitcham Taproom, every 100 pints you drink, they plant one tree.

K73. Shifty 5.2% Flagship pale ale. Available in the bar inside Le Gothique. A New England Pale, Medium-bodied beer that is fermented with Vermont yeast and combined with classic Citra and Mosaic hops. Think punchy, think fruity, think tropical; this is the taste bomb you've been dreaming of. Available all the year round in the main bar at Le Gothique.

K74. Crush 4.2% HAZY This beer is on the bar inside Le Gothique. Crush is Drop Projects take on the New England session style of beer. Big on flavour but only 4.2%. Brewed with a combination of Barley, Wheat and three types of Oats it pours a hazy pale straw colour. The hops. Simcoe, Citra, Mosaic, Ekuanot and Azacca collectively deliver an explosion of orange peel, mango, melon and pine.

K75. Bolt 5.4% Naturally Cloudy. This 5.4% Kellerbier is a traditional unfiltered lager that offers a truly authentic taste experience. Brewed with Hallertau hops, it features a delicate balance of floral and herbal notes, underscored by a subtle bitterness. The natural cloudiness from the unfiltered brewing process lends a smooth, full-bodied mouthfeel, while the moderate alcohol content ensures a perfectly refreshing finish.

K76 Labyrinth 6.0% This HAZY IPA is bursting with tropical fruit flavours and aromas. On the nose, expect a mix of ripe mango, pineapple, and citrus zest. The palate follows with juicy notes of peach, tangerine, papaya, grapefruit, stone fruit, and a hint of pine.

Full Circle

K77. Pinky Promise 4.5% SOUR 400kg of fresh peach and raspberry were poured into this sharp & tangy beer. A combination which can make you feel nostalgic for the frozen lollies of your childhood. The sweetness provided by the ripe fruit is immediately balanced by the lip-puckering sourness on the finish.

Hawkstone, College Farm, Stow Rd, Cheltenham

The first 2 beers to emerge from Jeremy Clarkson's Hawkstone Brewery

K78. Hawkstone Premium Lager 4.8% According to Jeremy Clarkson the original Hawkstone Lager is "Bold, yet balanced, with a smooth body and top notes of light citrus complemented by a subtle, crisp bitterness and malty backbone. Setting the standard for a British Premium Lager"

K79. Hawkstone Pils 3.8% This Pils places the hops at the forefront and packs character into this light-bodied lager. Once poured, the beer gives off distinct fruity and floral aromas and, upon tasting, provides grapefruit notes up-front followed by a light, bittersweet finish.

Manhattan Project, Dallas, Texas, USA

As with most craft beer businesses, Manhattan Project Beer Company began as a passionate hobby. Three partners came together in 2010 to create a beer for a wedding.

After an 8-month design period, the project proved to be a success. Their creative, collaborative, experimental, and scientific approach to beer making made the name Manhattan Project applicable. This really is like rocket fuel.

K80. Plutonium 239 6.2% Chocolate and in-house toasted coconut beer

Omnipollo, Roving brewers who "cuckoo brew" throughout Europe

K81. Peach Melba Creme Brûlée 6.0% SOUR The latest crème brûlée inspired fruited sour ale is brewed with raspberries, peaches and finished with milk sugar and finely ground vanilla. Tart raspberries that contrast with sweet peaches, vibrant and colourful in both taste and appearance.

Brewed at De Proefbrouwerij in Belgium.

K82. Grapefruit Ranch Water 5.0% SOUR A juicy and drinkable, tart and zesty grapefruit & lime flavoured sour ale.

K83. Levon Belgian Pale 6.5% This is for you if you tired of drinking bland lager. Omnipollo's first ever beer, Levon is assertively hopped and fermented dry using champagne yeast. The yeast and the hops in combination with a simple malt bill provides the beer with a quality of being rich in taste yet very refreshing.

Play Brew, Cannon Park Way, Middlesbrough, Teeside

K84. Yellow Star Banana Split Stout 5.5% A rich and dark stout, creamy and fruity. Expect a subtle bitterness with emphasis on the smooth banana flavour.

Polly's, Holland Farm, Black Brook, Mold. North Wales

K85 Cherry Sour 4.5% A love story five years in the making finally reaches its apex, sweet morello cherries dance alongside gentle sourness, with a slight savoury edge.

K86 Falling Leaves 5.9% HAZY. A trio of hops – Azacca, Citra and Centennial, Fresh cut citrus fruits, tropical notes, and just a hint of grassiness for balance. Massive.

K87 Manor Detail 5.1% HAZY The Holy Trinity hop combination of Azacca, Citra and Simcoe is a pretty hard combination to beat when it comes to high juice, low bitterness beer. Expect a fruit salad of juicy mango, fresh cut citrus fruits, blueberries, and tangerine.

Sambrook's Brewery, Wandsworth SW18

K88 Pagoda Pilsner 4.5% Named after the Battersea Park, peace pagoda (which was built without any Planning Permission until given retro planning by Red Ken Livingstone) This beer is a classic take on German pilsner style. Light, grassy and clear.

K89 Meltdown 8.0% Double IPA. Hoppy combination of Citra, Simcoe and Nelson Sauvin together with a massive dose of pale malt. Hazy after it has been dry hopped to leave as much citrus and fruity flavour in as possible without being too bitter.

Sycamore USA

K90 Drippy 7.0% A India Pale Ale (from USA) Golden and hazy (so not actually an IPA at all) Tropical creamy juicy mango! Fresh and fruity from first sip to last drip. Aroma of orange, vanilla, floral, mango, mixed berries

Tastes of mandarin orange, lime, grapefruit, tangerine, paired with vanilla.

Unbarred, Brighton & Hove, Sussex

K91. Honeycombe Milkshake 6.0% Full bodied, 6% honey, vanilla and lactose packed Milkshake Pale Ale from Brighton's Unbarred Brewery. This super smooth beer features Brighton & Hove honey, flaked oats, wheat and El Dorado hops. Expect a soft, beautifully creamy mouthfeel, with subtle hints of honey and vanilla. Think Crunchie bar in a glass – MUST TRY

Virginia Beer Company Williamsburg, Virginia USA

K92. Liquid Escape 4.4% Lemongrass and a touch of Australian sea salt Gose.

Verdant, Falmouth, Cornwall

K93. Yuzu 10 years 6.5% A beer brewed in conjunction with Japanese brewer, Masahiro. This is a special IPA that is loaded with Citra and Mosaic hops. The twist comes with a whack of Yuzu juice in the fermenter. Expect huge citrus and tropical flavours with a slight tart citric note from the yuzu. This is very special. This is fully loaded as they say. For serious beerheads only.

K94 Death by Cherries 4.5% SOUR A mouth wateringly jammy, soured fruit beer, full to the brim with black cherries for an intense, rich sweet and sour brew. As vibrant in flavour as it is in colour.

Wylam

K95. Transatlantic Krush 6.4% Introducing the newly named hop... Krush. also known as HBC-586. An experimental hop which delivers a medley of fruit flavours of Mango, Guava and Lychee. After a number of years in trials it has now become fully commercial into the hop world as Krush. This is a vibrant, hop-forward brew, loaded with Citra, Idaho 7, and Krush hops. Balanced with tropical stone fruits of Mango, Pineapple, and Passion fruit.

Yonder Brewing, Radstock, Somerset

K96. Red Jelly & Ice Cream 6.6% SOUR Yonder was started in 2018, and this beer was brewed to celebrate their 6th birthday. Red raspberry jelly with a generous dose of vanilla.

K97. Rocky Road Stout 5.0% Chock-a-block with flavours of vanilla marshmallow, crumbly biscuit pieces, dried red cherry, sweet, creamy caramel, and rich, dark chocolate, it's a pastry stout paradise. WHAT IS PASTRY STOUT? Pastry stout is a modern craft beer phenomenon that takes specialty beers to the extreme. Packing massive sweetness and the flavours often found in desserts and pastries into a strong dark stout, the beers are often highly sought-after.
